

#### Is Gnosticism a Problem for Christians Today?

Well, before we can answer that question, we need to talk about what Gnosticism is. Gnosticism is the belief that human beings need special knowledge to be able to shed their physical bodies and become spiritual beings. Why would humans want to do that? Because, according to Gnosticism, the physical world is inherently flawed because it was created by a god called a demiurge who is lesser than the highest beings of the universe who are spiritual beings called the Aeons. Jesus then comes to give this special knowledge to humans so they can ascend up the ladder to be spiritual beings. So if we break down the story of Gnosticism into it's most basic parts it would be something like this: The spiritual world is the real world, the physical world is flawed and lesser. Humans need to access the special knowledge of the spiritual world given by Jesus and leave the physical world behind. To us as Christians, some of that sounds a little crazy and some of it might not sound that far off from what we believe. Let's break down the story of the Bible into it's core components and see how it compares: God creates the world, physical and spiritual, and it is very good. Humanity and creation fall into sin and then are redeemed by Jesus. One day all of creation will be restored. One of the key differences here is how the world was created. In Gnosticism, the physical world is bad, but in Christianity, the physical world is created by God and is made good. The end of the story is also different. In Gnosticism, you want to flee from the physical world and live only as a spiritual being. This is the part that might be attractive for us as Christians as well, to want to flee the world and live only as a spirit. However, in the story of the Bible, the end game is for creation to be restored. Heaven and Earth reunited again, not permanently separated. God crafted a beautiful creation, and He doesn't intend on leaving it behind. That is why the work of Jesus means everything for us; Jesus rose again from the dead to defeat death, and He will raise us on the last day to live with Him eternally in the fully restored new creation.

SMP Program Update: I will be finished with my 3<sup>rd</sup> class this month! This 3<sup>rd</sup> class is called the Master Narrative and is all about telling God's story and understanding how every person has their own story that fits inside of God's story. After this class is over, I won't have any homework from Thanksgiving until after Christmas, so I am excited for a little break there! Thank you for your continued prayers and support.


## **Advent Folders**

- Two important dedications took place in the month of November. The first was the dedication of the completed church and school "Committed to Grow" project in November, 1994. And then, it was just a short 7 years ago, in Nov. 2015, that we celebrated with a dedication ceremony for the Pennsylvania Rd Campus Sanctuary.

## **Pastor's Message**

## "Eschatological Stewardship"

The Church Year has a rhythm to it, like our calendar year. As one season ends and another begins, our activities and plans change. Likewise, themes change, as we move from one part of the church year to the next. November has us thinking about Thanksgiving and being grateful. November in the church year is about Jesus' Second Coming, or End Times. The study of end times is called eschatology from the Greek "eschaton," which means "last things." We live in the last times. Jesus could return any day. We are encouraged to prepare for Jesus' return throughout the New Testament. In fact, the Early Church was certain Jesus would return in their lifetime. This worldview would have a profound effect on stewardship, the way in which we manage earthly resources. The same is true for us today. November is Stewardship Month, and our theme is "Eschatological Stewardship." Our giving reflects our faith in Jesus' return. We know this world is temporary, so we don't cling to it. We recognize the world's limitations, so we don't build our foundation on it. We are thankful for all that God gives to us, so we gladly and willingly give back to Him.
