

The season of Advent is upon us! Advent is our time of preparation for the coming King. Thinking of the coming King Jesus reminds me of the song Reckless Love. This is a modern worship song, and it is one of the school kids' favorites to sing right now. This is part of the chorus, speaking of God's love for us: "It chases me down, fights 'til I'm found, leaves the 99. I couldn't earn it and I don't deserve it, still You give yourself away." As I think about the story of the Bible, I can't help but think that this is what this whole story is about: A God who relentlessly comes after His people, even from the very beginning, with the first humans, Adam and Eve. Even after they had sinned, it was not God who wanted to stay away from them because they were sinful; it was them who hid from God. God came looking for them. Genesis 3:9, "But Yahweh (God) called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" Then we have thousands of years of history, starting with Abraham, where God refuses to give up on His people. No matter how many times they turn away, He keeps coming back for them. And finally, Jesus comes to save His people, once and for all. I pray that, as we make preparations for Christmas this year, we can remember that God always comes back for His people, and there's nowhere that the grace and love of Jesus can't reach.


## This Month in CTK History





# Pastor's Message

Griffith Thomas, in his classic work "Christianity is Christ", concluded the chapter entitled "The Virgin Birth of Christ" with the following thought, "The ultimate decision will perhaps only be arrived at by settling the question as to what Jesus came into the word to do. If the one thing that man needs is illumination, then ideas will suffice, and no Divine Incarnation is necessary, but if there is such a thing as sin in the world, we must predicate a Divine, sinless Redeemer to deal with it. For such a Redeemer, the only adequate explanation, so far as His earthly origin is concerned, is the ancient belief of the Church Universal that He was 'conceived of the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary." (Christianity is Christ, 1916, p. 132) The miracle of the Incarnation is the heart of our Advent and Christmas celebration. Our celebration is very different than the world's commercial observance. There is such a thing as "sin in the world", as Thomas says. We don't need more reminders of that. Unfortunately, we see it every day. Jesus took on our flesh to offer His body as the sacrifice for the sins of the world. Mary and Joseph's humble entrance into Bethlehem foreshadows the Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem thirty-three years later. We cannot look at the manger without also seeing the cross. The angelic chorus to the shepherds heralding His birth previews the message of the angel, "He is not here. He is risen." God's blessings on your Advent and Christmas celebration. Let us rejoice in the story of our salvation!
