



LENTEN SERMON SERIES: VICAR BROOKS

The Seminary class that I took last Fall was called The Master Narrative. The class was all about learning what the story of God is and how we live in and profess that story as God's people. As part of that class, I had to design a service series that walks through the story of God. We, as a church, are going to now use that service series for our Lenten services. This is one of the benefits of the SMP program: assignments like this are not future hypotheticals; I get to put what I am learning into practice immediately! So the overall theme for our Lenten services will be The Story of God. Here is a preview of what we will focus on each week.

Week 1 - God's Story or My Story?

Week 2 - Creation - And God Saw that it was Good

Week 3 - Redemption - The Story Points to Jesus

Week 4 - Jesus Rescues, not Abandons

Week 5 - New Creation - What is the End of this Story?

Week 6 - Where Do I Fit in this Story?

I pray that we can all grow together as a community and as the people of God as we worship together in the name of Jesus and participate in the Story of God!



The other day during our Wednesday morning school chapel service, we sang the hymn "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." Martin Luther wrote the famous hymn years after nailing the 95 theses to the church door in Wittenberg in 1517.

From Verse 4:

God's Word forever shall abide, no thanks to foes, who fear it For God Himself fights by our side with weapons of the Spirit Were they to take our house, goods, honor, child, or spouse, Though life be wrenched away, they cannot win the day. The Kingdom's ours forever!

Luther did not exactly have an easy go of things because of the stances that he took in standing up for the Word of God. He was persecuted and often in danger and on the run. The first line of the hymn "A mighty fortress is our God, a sword and shield victorious" echo the words of Psalm 46: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Luther took solace and comfort in the Word of God, and the Psalms are particularly great for this. As we prepare to celebrate Easter together, may the Word of God give us daily comfort and strength, just as it did for Luther!



Prayer Partners



Has God been preparing you for this moment?

Stephen Ministry began in 1975. Today, the ministry is more than 13,000 congregations, with 180 Christian denominations participating. There are Stephen Ministers in all 50 states, as well as over 30 other countries. Stephen Ministry Leaders number over 75,000; Stephen Ministers number over 600,000.

Christ The King Lutheran Church joined Stephen Ministry in the mid-1990s. We sent a pastor and two lay people at that time to be trained as Stephen Leaders. Through the years, others have followed their path, and the ministry is actively serving today.

Stephen Ministry is...

- A ministry named after Stephen, the first deacon in the early church, commissioned by the apostles to care for the community's needs.
- A meaningful way for our congregation to more fully use our gifts in sharing one another's burdens and joys.
- A one-to-one ministry by well-trained Christ The King parishioners.
- A response to Christ's instruction, "to love one another as I have loved you."

Does this resound with your heart for ministering to others? Consider becoming a Stephen Minister.

For Your Consideration:

- Stephen Ministry is focused on Jesus. The gift of mercy is critically important.
- An information meeting is held for those interested in becoming a Stephen Minister. This year, it is scheduled for September 11, 2023. We'll put out reminders as the day gets close.
- Training is on Mondays for 20 sessions of 2.5 hours each (50 hours total).
- Once trained and commissioned into active caring ministry, Ministers are confidentially assigned a Care Receiver. In general, Stephen Ministers meet an assigned Care Receiver each week for one hour. The relationship lasts as long as needed.
- Confidentiality is critically important.
- For mutual support, Stephen Ministers meet twice a month on Mondays. Continuing education is a regular part of the meetings to further equip and hone ministry skills.


Free Book

Pastor's Message

There would have been a time in Jesus' earthly ministry when "everything changed." Perhaps it was after Peter's confession of Jesus as the Christ (Matthew 16:13), or as Peter, James, and John walked silently down the mountain with Jesus after the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1). The beginning of Jesus' ministry was filled with excitement and possibilities. Granted, there was the occasional tense verbal exchange with religious leaders, like the scribes and Pharisees, but the majority of time was spent with grateful crowds rejoicing in the potential fulfilled promise of a Messiah. Families were lifted out of despair with miracles of healing. Communities were given hope with Jesus' teaching. Hundreds flocked wherever He would go just to see Him. Thousands left a hillside having been fed from five loaves and two fish. But then Jesus "set His face toward Jerusalem." His walk became very intentional. None of this Pinterest, namby-pamby "the destination is the journey" nonsense. The destination is the cross. Jesus will walk straight to it. It will look like a forced death march. It is not. It is the Son of God, choosing to die as the sacrifice for the sins of the world. The disciples watched it play out in real time and had no idea what was happening until the Holy Spirit blessed them at Pentecost. The Holy Spirit blesses us today in the Word of God. We know Jesus' purposeful path to the cross as our Lenten season. Whatever you do this season give something up, take something on, attend mid-week Lenten services, spend more time in devotion and Bible reading—may it help "fix your eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith."
