

Last month, we celebrated the miracle of Easter and sang "Glory to God" and "Alleluia!" The music, songs and choir were beautiful!! That is why this month we reflect on the beautiful music being made at Christ The King Church. "Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord" Psalm 95:1


The pipe organ at the Trenton Road sanctuary was built specifically for CTK by the Casavant Freres Company, headquartered in Quebec, Canada. It was founded in 1879 and is still in business today. It was 60 years ago this month (May 6, 1963) that we signed a contract to purchase our pipe organ for \$26,500 dollars (about \$260,000 dollars today!). This organ has over twelve hundred pipes!!! When playing this beautiful instrument, Tim Bode wears special shoes so that he can feel the peddles better and keep them clean. The organ was dedicated in May of 1965, with a celebration of song and music. The concert celebration included hymns and songs by our own choir and the A Capella Choir from Concordia College in Ann Arbor. The grand piano in the chancel was donated to CTK in May of 1995. Prior to that, the piano was leased.

In the first few years after the founding of CTK, the choir was directed by the Pastor. Then, in 1956, Mrs. Wilson assumed the directorship. There have been many choir directors over the years. There have also been several Junior Choirs formed over the years. The first Junior Choir was established in the Fall of 1959, with Mrs. Biesenthal serving as its director. In 1976, another Youth choir was formed, and starred at the Thanksgiving Eve service.





There will be no 4th Thursday Bible Study this month.



There are no coincidences in the Bible. This is a phrase that I have started using over and over again while teaching middle school religion classes. We have some incredibly sharp young thinkers in our congregation, and it is a true blessing for me to get to discuss God and the Bible with them on a weekly basis. A few weeks ago, one of them raised their hand and said "I don't think it's a coincidence that Iesus was in the desert for 40 days when He was tempted, because the Israelites were in the desert for 40 years." That led us into an entire discussion on how Jesus was fulfilling the Old Testament story and what the number 40 means. The more we read the Bible, the more these non-coincidences will stand out to us. Everything that happens in the Bible happens for a reason. There's no extra info in there. God chose every word to be written for one purpose: that we and all people would believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing we would have life in His name. The Bible is a gift for us that reveals who God is. So the next time you read something in the Bible that seems like it could be a coincidence, remember that everything is in there for a reason and ask yourself, "How does part of the story help point me to Jesus?" I pray that all of us will be lead to discover more and more of who God truly is each and every day.

SMP Program Update: I have a few weeks left in class number 5. I am learning about law and Gospel, active and passive righteousness, the three uses of the law, and more. My next class is in Saint Louis at the end of June, so I am looking forward to that trip. Thank you so much for your support and for your prayers. The classes are challenging, but I am learning a ton and the lessons I am learning are always immediately applicable to our church here at Christ The King, so that has been really awesome!


# Moms on Wheels


