This Month in CTK History


Time to "FALL" into CTK history!!! CTK celebrated several major milestone events during the month of October. Enjoy reminiscing and reviewing the history of CTK during the month of October through the years.

- On October 7, 1951, the White Chapel was dedicated as the first church for CTK. The White Chapel was a small wooden chapel (painted white). It was used until our present sanctuary was built.
- Sunday School began on October 14, 1951.
- On October 23, 1962, a Couples Club was organized through the Board of Christian Education.
- On October 19, 1964, a new paper folding machine was purchased by redeeming "TV Savings Stamps" and is still in use today!! (Who remembers licking stamps and the booklets to paste them into?)
- On October 11, 1965, new members were invited to an "Evening with Pastor" at the parsonage.
- A stone altar in the courtyard was dedicated on October 18, 1965. The stones were donated by members.
- On October 12, 1971, a special voter's meeting was held to call a pastor. The invitation stated that "This is an OPEN MEETING and the women are cordially invited to attend. All men of the congregation, ages 20 and over are eligible to vote." (It would be another ten years until the ladies of the congregation were granted voting rights.)
- In October of 1979, a kick-off banquet was held at Crystal Gardens for the gymnasium and parish center. Also, the first Spiritual Gifts class was conducted.
- Carillon Bells were added in October 1995.
- On October 11, 1995, Pastor Harry Edenfield marked his 25th year in Ministry! What a blessing for our Christian community!
- A "Parish Nurse" program was formed under the Social Ministry committee on October 16, 1997. Also, CTK received a Beautification Award from the City of Southgate for the 2nd year in a row!
- On October 7, 2001, Christ The King Lutheran Church celebrated its 50th Anniversary with a worship service and banquet. Now, we are looking forward to our 75th anniversary in just two short years!

These are just some of the more notable events and happenings at CTK during the month of October. The above information has been collected from CTK Newsletters, meeting minutes, 50th anniversary booklet, and newspaper clippings. Hope you enjoyed looking back through the CTK archives and learning some of the history that makes Christ The King Church so special!

Young Adult Volunteer

No longer in Youth Group, but you want to go to the gathering??? **VOLUNTEER!**

Young Adult Volunteers (YAVs) are adults ages 19–25 who serve as role models and servant leaders throughout the Gathering. Young Adult Volunteers commit to:

- Paying a \$400 volunteer registration fee
- Staying in assigned Gathering hotel accommodations covered by the Gathering (with 4 or more same-gendered volunteers)
- Attending volunteer training July 17–18, 2025 in New Orleans
- Serving the Gathering July 19–23, 2025 in New Orleans

The \$400 registration fee supplements your hotel costs. You are roomed by gender and 4 or more to a room. The Gathering covers all housing costs but YAVs pay for their own transportation and most meals.

The YAV application is open until December 31, 2024. YAVs must commit to attending the Gathering and serving July 17–23, 2025 (plan to arrive midday on July 17 to attend the first night's training). YAVs who arrive prior to July 17 or want to stay later than July 23 will need to make their own arrangements.

Pastor's Message

I was watching a documentary about the Apollo 13 space mission. A key moment in the rescue of the astronauts was correctly mapping out the return course. The data had to be transferred from the command module and had to be done 100% correct—zero mistakes. One wrong number may be a small mistake, but that single wrong degree would be fatal, given the number of miles to get back to earth. This reminds me of the state of the church on earth in the centuries leading up to the Reformation. The "one mistake" was not having the Word of God in the peoples' languages. The Bible was written in Hebrew and Greek. By the 5th century, it had been translated into Latin, the common language in the time of the Roman Empire. The Empire fell. Latin died. The Middle Ages happened. The vast majority of people were illiterate, and those who could read didn't have a Bible in their language. The Bible was only read by the scholars. After centuries, the church was very much off course. Salvation was a prize to be earned, rather than a gift of God's mercy. Baptism and Holy Communion were rungs on a ladder to climb up to God, rather than His means of grace. One of the main results of the Reformation was getting the Bible into the hands of the people. Luther continued the work of John Huss and John Wycliffe, and we are beneficiaries of those heroes. May we never take God's Word for granted and, like the Small Catechism says, "gladly hear and learn it." In Christ, Pastor Jason Cashmer
