December is a busy month for all of us, with all the Christmas preparations. In looking back at our history, Christ The King has also been busy during December, preparing for Christmas.


In 1956, the first candlelight Christmas







<u>GriefShare</u>

I have learned that there are two major things that define Lutheran theology. The first one is Justification by grace alone, through faith alone. This means that there is only one way to salvation: Jesus, and Jesus alone. Article 4 of the Augsburg Confession is on Justification, and Martin Luther famously said that Article 4 is the article on which the church will stand or falls. The second big thing that I am learning that defines Lutheran theology is tension. We as Lutherans don't try to answer questions that God doesn't answer for us. For example, we believe that Jesus body and blood is really and fully present in the bread and wine in communion. We believe that because that's what scripture says. How can that be true? We don't try to answer that question because God has decided not to give us that answer. Maybe the most important tension is the tension that we all feel as Christians, who are in fact saved by grace, covered in the blood of Jesus, and yet we see and experience pain and suffering in the world around us. We live in two truths at the same time we still live in a fallen and broken world, and we are living eternal lives, even now in this life. And the reality is sometimes that doesn't make sense to us, but we still believe it. One day faith will be sight, and there will be no more tension in our lives, and until that day we hold onto the one thing that God has revealed to us that really matters: Jesus.

Seminary Update: I am finishing my last assignment for my fall class which is an exegetical course on the Old Testament. My next class is also exegetical, but on the New Testament.
