We are really in need of younger retirees to help organize outside overhang drop off, take scrap to the dumpster, and empty all garbage. We also bring over any new donated items and clothes over from building #9 to hang up on Wednesdays. Although department heads can come over any day to work on their departments, several always come on Tuesdays for the comradery, and sometimes lunch provided by Nancy Gyorke.

We also need people to help organize and mainly hang up clothes on Wednesday mornings from <u>10:00 to 11:00 or 12:00</u> depending on the amount of clothes and the number of people.

The Donation Station is on it's 17th year, and is happy to say is run completely by volunteers. We are also thankful that this spring the D.S. will present the School with its annual \$10,000 gift, and \$5,000 to the Children's HopeChest. The bulk of our earnings goes to upkeep, equipment purchases and repair of the CTK campus, Youth Group, 8th grade class trip, Bible Study Books, with \$500 each month donated to the Food Pantry. This Month in CTK History



March 1954 was a very busy month for CTK!At the beginning of the month, adult infor-

mation classes started, and the Constitution
for CTK was approved by the Michigan District.
The end of the month saw preparations be-

ing made for the new church. Architects were busy with choosing interior colors for the new church, and Mr. McFee and his son were asked

to lay the corner stone to take place in April. Mr. McFee and his son had made the stone.

- In March 1955, it was announced that there were going to be two services, starting in June: an early service at 8:30, and the regular service at 11am.
- It was announced in March, 1964 that Youth Sunday would be an annual event. Our teenagers were celebrated on the first Sunday of May with a special service and banquet.
- Acolytes started performing their duties in 1965. Their job was to light & extinguish the candles.
- In March 1974, Reverend Lawrence Kinne received and accepted a call to be the new pastor at CTK.
- Twenty-five years later, another pastor received a call to CTK in March of 1999. Pastor Jay Cashmer was extended a call for the position of Associate Pastor in 1999.

A common visual for the Lenten season is the three crosses silhouetted against a stark landscape, or a Judean sunset. The "crossview" might be from a great distance. It could be a brief glance as one walks along the road. It could be a close-up, even at the very foot of the cross. Seeing a cross, the Roman instrument of execution in first century Jerusalem, had a very different meaning than our • 21st century vision of the cross, which is today the worldwide symbol of Christianity. In a similar way, different people had different "crossviews." Pilate viewed the cross very differently than Joseph of Arimathea, who viewed it very differently than Simon of Cyrene. During the season of Lent, we will consider various views of the cross from • the historical narrative. This year we have a "late Easter," April 20, which means Ash Wednesday is March 5. Our Lenten services are Wednesdays (March 5-April 9) at 3:30 • and 7pm (same service) with a meal in between, serving from 4:30 to 6:30pm. These special times of worship are designed to help focus our hearts and minds on the incred-• ible sacrifice made by our Savior, Jesus. We hope that you • can attend the Lenten services.
