Armed Forces Day 2025 - Saturday, May 17th

On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy and Air Force Days. The single-day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under the Department of Defense. (<u>https://afd.defense.gov</u>)

This celebration is unique to Memorial Day and Veterans Day in that it honors those currently in the armed forces for our country. The LCMS encourages congregations to remember and honor service personnel through prayer, recognition and providing resources.

Memorial Day 2025 – Monday, May 26th

Why do we celebrate Memorial Day? To honor the men and women who sacrificed their lives while serving in the U.S. military in times of war and peace.

The History of Memorial Day (Resource: U.S. Army Airborne & Special Operations Museum https://www.asomf.org/the-history-of-memorial-day/)

May 5, 1866

- Waterloo, New York held a community-wide event during which businesses closed, and residents decorated the graves of Civil War soldiers with flowers and flags. General John Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans,
 - called for a nationwide day of remembrance. He stated:
- "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion [Civil War], and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land."
- Logan declared this day as Decoration Day and chose May 30th because it wasn't the anniversary of any Civil War battle.
- By 1890 each state had made Decoration Day an official state holiday.
- After WWI the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars.
- 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as a Federal Holiday celebrated on the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. This act took effect in 1971.

Memorial Day Prayer

Sacrificing Savior,

At the end of the first World War, people gave thanks for the peace which had been won in the "war to end all wars." They knew that humanity had learned its lesson; they thought we would remember the terrible cost. They were wrong. People forget. We forgot the sacrifice. We forgot the cost. Since then, nations have engaged in global conflicts and regional feuds. Memorial Day, set aside to remember is being used to grab an extra hour of sleep and cut the grass. Dear Lord, help us gratefully remember the ongoing sacrifices being made by our military. Let us remember <u>Name</u> and all the others for what they are doing. Most of all, let us remember Your sacrifice and the battle You won to secure our salvation. You fulfilled the laws we had broken, resisted the temptations that tripped us up, and died the death we deserved. Lord, for the only true victory over death may we always be grateful. Amen.

Some of the best known Words in all of Scripture are the closing Words of Matthew. Jesus, speaking to the eleven, says, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always to the end of the age." We know these Words as the Great Commission. What I want you to notice about this mission that Jesus gave to the apostles is that it is long term, not short term. Baptizing a person only takes one day, but "making disciples" and "teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" takes time. It takes years, maybe even a whole lifetime. And this is a group activity. This is a mission that we all carry out together; it's not just for missionaries or pastors or people with the gift of evangelism. The mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ is for all of us, and you never know what is going to spark a fire in someone's life: an invite to worship with you on a Sunday, or to attend a fellowship event together, letting someone know that you have been praying for them, or maybe a kind gesture done in the name of spreading the love of Jesus. Sometimes spreading the gospel can seem like a monumental task - and that's because, well, it is a monumental task! But remember, God will do the heavy lifting. He promises to work in the world through His people, by His Word!

I just have a few more weeks to go on this one, and then I will be headed to St. Louis in June for my Summer class. That one is another preaching class, which I am really looking forward to!
