Never stop learning new things. This is particularly important when it comes to God, and what has been revealed to us as God's creation, through the work and person of Jesus Christ, and

given to us through the story of the Scriptures. I was studying the first chapter of Matthew the other day to prepare to lead a Bible study. As you might already know, the first half of the first chapter of Matthew is not exactly a thrilling tale. It doesn't have you on the edge of your seat as an introduction to this grand story told in the New Testament. No, the beginning of Matthew is: a genealogy: A list of names. And it's a long list. And the names are hard to pronounce. At first, it might seem like there is nothing we can possibly learn from a long list of names. But make no mistake - God doesn't waste words. And as I was studying, I learned something I never noticed before in Matthew's genealogy. Genealogies in the Bible almost always follow the father's line. Father to son, father to son. But here in Matthew, there are five women mentioned, four of whom are known to readers of the Old Testament and one who is not. The four are Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and Bathsheba. These four women have a lot in common. They are all outsiders. They all have some perceived scandal that other people see in them. And they all are individually responsible for carrying on God's story. Without God working through each of them, there would not be a story. And then a fifth women is named in the genealogy, a girl named Mary. The mother of the Messiah. She fits in with the other women, but also stands out in a way, too. Unlike the others, her Son would die to save the people from their sin. Her Son would rise again to eternal life. Her Son would change the world forever. All of that baked into a long list of hard-to-pronounce names – God, and His Word, are truly amazing!

Seminary Update: I am in the midst of my Fall classes. I am in a class called The Church and Its Life and I am also in Greek class. Greek is especially challenging, but also very rewarding! Thank you for your prayers and your support!




ALTAR FLOWERS




From Trenton Church of Christ Shepherd's Closet




